Attendance

Does attendance really matter? Does one or two days here or there matter? Research has demonstrated that the higher the attendance of a student, the higher your GCSE grades are at the end of Year 11. Attendance above 95% in KS4 equals one grade difference across all GCSE grades and increases the chances of you achieving a grade 4 or higher in English and Maths. Therefore, if you want to be successful this year, then 'yes' it does matter.

Little and often is the key with languages. When putting together your revision timetable make sure you timetable in slots for all skills e.g. Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing. 20-30 mins a session is advisable.

Vary what you do and make it active and enjoyable.

Use <u>www.quizlet.com</u> to revise your vocabulary and download the app so you can do it on the move.

When working with a past paper, make sure you only do 1 or 2 questions at a time and really analyse the question. What are the examiners wanting? Why did I get this wrong? What vocabulary didn't I know? Make a list of all unknown vocabulary and learn it!

It's important to really know your case studies; help that knowledge go into your long-term memory by regularly going over key information. You could stick post-It notes onto the fridge with key information on or challenge yourself to recall 5 pieces of information before getting on the bus.

Know your command words. One of the biggest exam pitfalls is misunderstanding command words. Check you really understand what they are asking you to do. Use the examstyle practice questions to give yourself lots of practice of the type of questions you will encounter in the exams.

Students need to access the OCR J277 playlist to make sure they are watching content relevent to themselves. Similarly, using w3schools, geeksforgeeks and BBC Bitesize are good ways of reinforcing and furthering the knowledge required for their specification.	Programming is typically an area of the specification that students struggle with the most. I would recommend practicing several times a week to ensure the knowledge isn't lost between lessons and over the year. The best way to learn is by getting stuck in with coding. Students should think of little projects they want to create and work on them. It is recommended that students also understand why they are using certain bits of programming in certain ways, some students would benefit from an interactive learning platform such as exercism.com, w3schools or geeksforgeeks.
