

Elizabethan Academy Sixth Form Students Celebrate

Students at The Elizabethan Sixth Form are celebrating an excellent set of results this summer, reflecting the dedication, resilience and ambition of this year's cohort.

The results represent a significant increase on last year, with students achieving even stronger outcomes across a range of subjects. The proportion of the highest grades (A*-A) has more than doubled compared with 2025 with 1 in 5 grades now at this standard, while overall average attainment is up by almost 15%, demonstrating the continued upward trajectory of the Sixth Form.

Among the highlights of this year's results, nearly two-thirds of all A Level grades were awarded an A*-C grade. The Sixth Form also recorded positive student progress outcomes, demonstrating that students achieved beyond expectations. Alongside these strong academic outcomes, students studying vocational and applied qualifications continued to achieve well, reflecting the breadth and strength of the Sixth Form curriculum.
