

Dear Parents/Carers

We have had another busy week in school with Year 10 students coming in “bubbles” as well as having our “blue bubble” (children of key workers and vulnerable students). We also seem to have a deer which has decided to enrol at the Elizabethan and we have spent much of the week trying to coax it back to Idle Valley. It has been great to have more students back in school and we are going to extend Year 10 bubbles coming into school until the 10 July. The week commencing 13 July we will be welcoming in our Year 12 (soon to be Year 13) students, as well as having online induction sessions for our new Sixth Form students. I am delighted that we will be welcoming back more Year 11 students into our Sixth Form than ever before. This is not only due to our broad curriculum which includes languages, arts, technology, as well as other academic A levels, but because students have such positive relationship with staff and appreciate the quality of teaching and pastoral care in the academy.

However, we are determined to run our summer school for Year 7 and 8 students at the start of the holidays and we will also be running transition for new Year 6 students in August. Thank you for continuing to support your son/daughter’s education and do not hesitate to get in touch if you have any concerns or need further support. You will have seen the government announcement yesterday regarding all students returning in September. We are currently planning how we can do this safely and will share this information with you when we have more detail.

Ofqual information

Ofqual have published further information this week on appeals and autumn exam arrangements:

- Students will be able to appeal – through their school or college – if they believe the process this summer was not followed correctly in their case
- Centres themselves can appeal if they believe something systemic has gone wrong in relation to their results.
- Any student unable to receive a calculated result, and others who would like to improve their grades, will have an opportunity to take the full suite of GCSE, AS and A level exams in the autumn.
- With the exception of art and design, grades will be based on exam performance alone, with no non-exam assessment.
- The exact timing of the exams has yet to be revealed, but Ofqual is aiming for AS and A levels to be held in October and GCSEs in November.

Summer School

A “Catch-Up” Summer School for Year 7 and Year 8 students will be running in the first week of the holidays 27th July – 31st July. Support will be offered to students who have struggled to access their schoolwork during the pandemic. We will be delivering catch-up lessons in a range of subjects as well as offering sessions on wellbeing. We look forward to seeing more of our students back in the Academy at the end of July!

Sixth Form – New Year 12 Induction

Parents will have received information regarding the induction process for the forthcoming academic year via letter earlier this week. The Induction process this year will largely be conducted remotely and commence on 14 July with Lee Dainty, Assistant Principal leading a Welcome Meeting via Teams followed by a number of subject specific Teams meetings led by academy staff over the remainder of the week. Students will have

received invites to the meetings relevant to them so please get them to check their emails and accept the invitation. We are looking forward to welcoming our new Sixth Form.





The course is completely free and can be accessed via laptop, PC, tablet or smart phone with all materials online. The course is a Level 1 Award in Professional Development for Employment and is designed to equip learners with invaluable employability skills. It covers: identifying skills and qualities (including those needed for employment), CV and cover letter writing, how to complete an application form, key interview tips and skills as well as a mock interview (via Zoom/Teams) with constructive feedback and a reflective evaluation. There is tutor support available throughout the course and on day one there is a comprehensive IAG session for each learner where they will discuss their career goals and complete a detailed ILP. The ideal candidate for this course are those at risk of becoming NEET and/or those that are in need of employability skills
