Mr Poore Maths Teacher

About me...

"I am the newest member of the mathematics faculty here at the Elizabethan Academy. Currently, I teach all key stages, including further mathematics for KS5. In addition to this, I also provide A-level Physics classes to our year 12 students. I have taken over the faculty leader's previous classroom so I can be found in MA7 or around the maths corridor. As well as my academic responsibilities, I also take a pastoral role as the form tutor for 9B1.

Before joining team EA, I was a teacher of mathematics at the Minster school in Southwell, working with many talented staff. In a previous life, before teaching, I was an academic researcher at Nottingham Trent University in their school of science and technology in the field of waveguide delamination and wave propagation. I also worked with the university of Nottingham and FarUK as an engineering consultant for a large excavation project in Leicester.

I am thrilled to take this next step on my journey and I'm proud to be a part of the Elizabethan team!"

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All students in Years 7 to 11 have been issued with a student planner for the academic year 23-24. This is to support our students in developing their responsibility with regards to home learning. The planner has a double page spread for each week of the year, which contains a Mon-Fri notes page and a to do list. Students will be recording their homework in the planner - we ask that you check and sign their planner on a weekly basis to ensure they are completing their home learning. By doing this, we are supporting our students to build routines and habits in order to fully prepare them for revising at home for the external exams.

The planner is also for you and school to communicate with each other, the weekly notes pages can be used for communication that home or school need to be aware about; it is a quick and easy way for all members of our school community to keep in contact with each other.

The planner is not just about recording homework, you will find our home-school partnership agreement for parents and students, information on our values of the 3R's, attendance, reward points, presentation in books, school council and the Think Pink pages, which will be where the students will track their progress in the subjects across the year. Towards the end of the planner, are subject specific pages, a reading log and information on wellbeing, mobile phone management and exam skills.

This year, we are committed to fostering a robust reading culture within our school community. Opportunities to read in every lesson: We are committed to finding opportunities for reading in every subject. Whether it's reading the lesson objective aloud or extracting information from a textbook, students will be encouraged to maximise every chance to read and expand their knowledge.







Attendance matters!

Safeguarding matters!

One of our whole school priorities this year is to improve attendance and punctuality, so we have increased capacity in our attendance team to enable us to complete more home visits where a student's attendance is causing us concern. We have increased the rewards for excellent attendance but the biggest reward for attending school every day is that your child has no gaps in learning, knowledge and understanding and is accessing all the wonderful opportunities we offer in school ... the effects of this on mental health and wellbeing can't be over-estimated.

Miss Clark's safeguarding assembly, at the end of last year, on why good attendance matters can be viewed <u>here.</u> The over-riding message is that attending school every day is an investment in student's futures so let's continue to work together to provide our young people with the best life chances.

Punctuality to school and lesson is equally important so from Tuesday next week students who are late will lose 10 mins of their break and/or lunch, depending on the point in the day they were late, to speak to senior staff and be reminded of the reasons why punctuality is so important ... it is a life-skill after all! Persistent lateness will result in a Friday after school leadership detention. Obviously, we are sensitive to the reasons Year 7 may arrive late as they familiarise themselves with secondary school routines.
